

## DISPOSING OR REPLACING YOUR SMARTPHONE

## **TYPES OF SENSITIVE DATA**

- Contact details of everyone in your address book.
- Personal photos, videos, and audio recordings.
- Stored passwords and access to your accounts, such as your bank, social media, or email.
- Texting or chat sessions within applications like secure chat, games, and social media.





## **WIPE YOUR DEVICE**

Simply deleting data is not enough, instead you should securely erase all the data on your device before disposing it off. The reset function varies among devices; listed below are the steps for the two most common devices.

- Apple iOS Devices: Settings | General | Reset | Erase All Content and Settings
- Android Devices: Settings | Privacy | Factory Data Reset

## **SIM & EXTERNAL CARDS**

- SIM card retains information about your account. If you plan to change your phone, number or your service provider, ensure you transfer or destroy the SIM.
- Some Android mobile devices utilize a removable SD (Secure Digital) card for additional storage. Remove these external storage cards from your mobile device prior to disposal.
